Greetings!

2021 has continued to be a difficult year all over the world, but particularly in Haiti. Even before the assassination of President Moise, political demonstrations were common. Since the assassination, it is more dangerous. Roving gangs kidnap and demand ransom, a beloved priest was killed in Cap Haitian while being robbed after visiting a bank. Inflation is rampant so the little money people have for basic needs buys even less. Hunger has increased. Malnutrition causes increased disease.

Despite all this, our ajan sante (community health workers) continue to work. In our latest report from Darlyng (one of the four ajan sante), she said they are making house calls, vaccinating babies and pregnant women, and distributing soap, Clorox to purify water, condoms, and dispensing electrolyte serum to prevent dehydration. The Covid vaccine has become available, and they work to educate and ease fears in the population.

The 24 HIV affected families continue to receive support through our partnership with Children's Place International. Food, transportation, emotional and educational assistance are just a few of the things that are provided to those families. CPI created a short video that you can see if you go to our website or Facebook page. It gives the viewer a good synopsis of the work being done.

Dr. Myrthil, the director of the State Clinic in Limonade, sent this message to us via WhatsApp. "I want you to let the board members of Konbit Lasante pou Limonade know that we really appreciate their effort to promote health in Limonade, by means of mobile clinics, support of our project for the health workers, and donations for the supplies to protect us against covid-19 in the state clinic. In the name of everyone at the state clinic we want to say thank you for everything."

Our plans for 2022 include:

- Continued funding of the stipends of the 4 ajan sante, as well as providing basic health supplies for them to distribute on their home health visits
- Continued support of 24 HIV affected families
- Mobile clinics to rural areas where there is no access to medical care
